

Pulling Out All the Stops (For the Wurlitzer)

For the last 125 years WHS has often pulled out all the stops, or given a great effort. 60 years ago, on a foggy night in the L.A. Coliseum, the classes of 1965-68 saw the Cardinals win the CIF 4A Football Championship, even as huge underdogs in each of 4 playoff games. This streak culminated with the defeat of Loyola H.S. and its 35-game winning streak in what the L.A.Times called: "the most historic overthrow in Southern California prep football annals."

Last year I attended the WHS All-Class BBQ and part of the program was the screening of an old silent movie to be accompanied by the singular Cardinal Wurlitzer organ. I still had to drive back to Las Vegas that evening and honestly I had planned on napping for the organ stuff.

However, when the lights dimmed and the music started, I found myself enthralled. All the figurative stops were pulled and the performance was compelling. So much so that I'm going to try to make the trip for future events the Alumni Association is considering, such as Wurlitzer backed silent spooky movies peripheral to future Halloweens, or Holiday carols in December.

By the way, "pulling out all the stops" is totally appropriate in promoting our Wurlitzer. The phrase accurately refers to something unique with organs, which can have thousands of pipes, and each has a stop, or a rod that can be manipulated in order to change the overall musical sounds emitted. This technology remained largely unchanged since the middle ages and is the basis of the phrase at hand.

When all the stops are pulled out, air flows every pipe loudly emits its own note.

Please consider supporting the Wurlitzer and its events. Maybe we can even arrange to pull out all the stops. I would love to hear what that sounds like.
