Remembering Morris Sawyer, Class of 1958

Whittier High School mourns the loss of Morris Sawyer, Class of 1958. Morris was a longtime Board Member of the Whittier High School Alumni Association, serving in various capacities, including Alumni Historian; He would frequently come to meetings to showcase artifacts from the Alumni Association archives, and periodically authored long-form research inquiries. Morris and his wife Lorraine, a Whittier High business and computing teacher who predeceased him, were 2008 inductees into the Whittier High School Alumni Association Hall of Fame. Morris was instrumental in establishing the alumni office, which now bears his name, and the Alumni Association archives located in the library basement.

Joe Vinatieri, now Mayor of Whittier, recalls that he worked alongside the Sawyers to institute the foundational procedures of the Alumni Association. "Morris had a love for Whittier High that transcended generations. Lorraine and Morris worked as a team to see that the newly minted Alumni Association captured and celebrated the past students, teachers and administrators, and, importantly, helped lay the foundation for an Association that benefited Cardinals to come" said Vinatieri.

Sawyer's niece Brandee recalls that he was a Cardinal faithful until the very end. The Thursday before his passing, Morris was visited by his home health nurse. When she was there, he was sleeping and would not wake up. She noticed he was wearing a Whittier High School spirit t-shirt so she asked him, "So, you went to Whittier High School, huh?" And he woke up! She said she could see him struggling to come out of his sleep and open his eyes and look at her and then he said, "Yes I did". She asked him if he played sports and he said, yes he played football there and he loved Whittier High School.


